

## Composition of St Andrew's Governing Body

St Andrew's has a governing body of approximately 11 members with representatives from 4 categories. The categories of governor at our school are as follows:

### **Parent**

Parent governors are elected by members of the parent community. They must have legal parental responsibility for a child registered as a pupil at our school.

### **Staff**

Staff governors are elected by all staff, either teaching or support staff. The headteacher is a member of the governing body by virtue of his/her office and counts as a member of the staff category.

### **Local Authority**

This category of governor is appointed by the Local Authority.

### **Community**

Community governors are appointed by the governing body to represent the wider community served by the school. The governing body is encouraged to recruit representatives from local business and charitable organisations. Appointments are made by nominations and voting by all governors at the full governing body meeting.

## St Andrew's Committee Structure

Our school currently has 2 combined committees :

Full Governors	<p>The governing body at St Andrew's works with the school. Individual governors have no power or responsibility. It is only the full governing body which has legal duties and powers and all governors share in that responsibility. Governors do not usually intervene in the day to day management of the school.
